Thank you for your interest in the Pickaway Leadership Fellows program! The next Fellows class will consist of ten sessions held between October 2019 and April 2020. This leadership program was formulated and funded through a county-wide strategic planning process in 2011, and is supported through the Pickaway Competitiveness Network (PCN) and the Pickaway County Community Foundation.

The strategic plan identified the need for appointed and elected leaders to understand the interrelationships of social, economic, political, and environmental institutions and organizations. The takeaway was that Pickaway County needs to invest in the next generation of leaders to keep this county viable and a desirable place to live.

This program is NOT a series of lectures or classes. It is designed as an "executive leadership" curriculum. The sessions are interactive, collaborative, and experiential. Your complete participation is key to a successful experience for both you and the other Fellows. We ask for your employers' signature on the application so they understand the commitment you are making to the Fellows program, Pickaway County and its future. In addition to eight in-county sessions there will be a two-day session in Columbus and a three-and-a-half day session in Washington, D.C.

Upon completion of this program participants will be able to use the title, "Pickaway Fellow". The title can be used on your resume, job applications, LinkedIn profile and website as the recognition for participation in and completion of the program.

The Fellows advisory committee members bring a diversity of professional experience, service contributions, political philosophy, and longevity in the county to plan and implement this program. However, all members of the advisory committee share the belief that the next generation of leaders for this county needs to be identified, nurtured, and promoted to keep Pickaway County a desirable place for businesses and families.

Cost of the Program

The 2019-2020 program cost is **\$650**. This includes meals and double-occupancy hotel accommodations. (If you prefer single-occupancy hotel accommodations, there will be an additional cost of approximately \$500.) Participants will also be responsible to provide and pay for transportation to and from Washington D.C. for the final session. For more details, please read the TUITION section in the expectations below.

Expectations

Sessions are held in various Pickaway County locations from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. except where otherwise noted.

ATTENDANCE: Attendance is key to the experience that this program provides to the individual. Each component of the program is designed to provide insight, perspective and experience that will be used in leadership situations. Participants are expected to attend and engage fully in all sessions, for the entire day, to be eligible to participate in the Washington, D.C. seminar.

ATTIRE: Business attire is the dress code unless otherwise noted.

TUITION: The tuition for the Pickaway Fellows program is \$650. If you prefer single-occupancy for hotel stays, there will be an additional charge of approximately \$500. The first half of tuition is due at the beginning of the class and second half is due prior to the Washington D.C. seminar. Tuition can be paid through personal resources, through an employer, a match between various sources, scholarships provided by various businesses and organizations, etc. The applicant is responsible for obtaining these funds. The advisory committee highly recommends applicants not let financial concerns stand in the way of application as there are many resources available to assist with tuition. One additional financial obligation for each participant is travel to and from Washington D.C. All other fees and expenses for the Columbus and D.C. experiences will be covered by the Fellows program.

HOMEWORK: Some "homework" assignments will be required. For this program, work outside the session is designed for self-reflection, observation, application of concepts, and as a basis for discussion. None of the homework assignments will be overwhelming or taxing on anyone's schedule.

POST-PROGRAM: Fellows completing the program will be expected as a group to decide on a service project. Details will be discussed during the sessions. Each Fellow is expected to seek their own level of commitment to public, private and philanthropic boards through appointments and volunteer work. Each participant, upon successful completion of the Fellows program, will be listed on the Pickaway County Community Foundation website.

Your signature below indicates your ability and willingness to attend *all sessions in their entirety*. Information will build from session to session; it is imperative to have attendance at all sessions. Additionally, check if you prefer single- or double-occupancy during hotel stays. This is non-binding and will be confirmed once participants are notified of their selection.
